For the musician that I am, this discovery, this **UNEXPECTED** gift, is not nothing! Let us judge!



In my opinion, the most remarkable accomplishment under the First Sounds banner was successfully playing a recording dating from 1860, 17 years before the invention of the Phonograph by Thomas Edison.

Lasting approximately 10 seconds, the historical sequence features the voice of a woman singing the well-known song:

« Au clair de la lune, Pierrot répondit ».

This recording was made on April 9, 1860 by the Parisian inventor Édouard-Léon Scott de Martinville on the said « phonautograph ».
